Drs. Vincent L. and Vance J. Moss are world-renowned surgeons with experience in laser surgery technology and clinical practice. The two created the Mid-Atlantic Multi-Specialty Surgical Group in Howell, N.J., to bring convenient access to state-of-the-art thoracic and urologic surgery to the region. They also provide the latest technology to help diminish the cravings associated with smoking cessation.

The identical twin brothers attended the United States Military Prep School at West Point and became majors in the U.S. Army Reserves Medical Corps. They both graduated with a B.S. in science from Pennsylvania State University and received their M.D.s from Temple University School of Medicine.

Drs. Vincent and Vance Moss have been honored with numerous awards for their dedication and hard work, including the ABC World News Person of the Year, N.J. Physician of the Year, Trumpet Award, Ellis Island Medal of Honor, Army Achievement Award and National Defense Service Medal. He also has introduced to Kimball Medical Center, N.J., a new, sophisticated surgical procedure for chronic gastroesophageal reflux disease called Nissen Fundoplication, a digestive condition that causes severe heartburn in nearly one-third of the American population.

Dr. Vance J. Moss is a urologist who specializes in advanced minimally invasive surgery to treat prostate cancer and kidney stones. He also is one of the pioneers who formed the Temple-Crozer Transplant Program, which is a collaborative effort between two of the region's leading health care providers to enhance the care of kidney transplant patients in Delaware County, Pa., and beyond.
